OMI & Howard Young Foundation's Tick-Borne Illness Center of Excellence


The Open Medicine Institute and the Howard Young Foundation have come together to create the Tick-Borne Illness Center of Excellence. This is a one-of-a-kind center that focuses on diagnosis, treatment, follow-up and research all together. There is nothing like it in our country to-date.

Currently, the Howard Young Foundation and the Women's Legacy Council, led by OMI are campaigning to raise \$3.5 million and are currently in the process of growing their staff of doctors that will be trained to diagnose, treat and follow up with Lyme patients.

The treating doctor at this time is Dr. Andreas Kogelnik, also director of the Open Medicine Institute. He has his MD from Emory University School of Medicine and also his PhD from Georgia Tech in Bioengineering. At Stanford University he was trained in internal medicine as well as infectious diseases. Dr. "Andy" Kogelnik founded the Open Medicine Institute in 2009.

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Nothing is new that we need new testing, however, IGenix testing has been around for over 25 years and at the moment they are the only way to test efficiently and effectively, giving patients hope for a diagnosis.
